REVIEW

This lesson is meant for review purposes. There are many ways to conduct a review. Here are some ideas for you.

1. It can be in a standard test format. Elementary 1 students should be able to answer the following types of questions without much difficulty: true or false, fill in the blank, and short answer. Depending on your class needs, feel free to create your own test by selecting questions found in the **Check for Understanding** section of each lesson. Alternatively, you can look through some of the **homework assignments** for ideas. Be sure to think about **life application questions** in addition to the knowledge-based ones. Never forget to ask the students to remember the **memory verses** that they have learned.
2. The review can be done as a game. Playing games is a fun way to share information. It can be a simple game like Jeopardy or a race to the finish line (moving spaces as students take turns to say the correct answer). Students can also create their own questions and quiz each other. The possibilities are endless!
3. You can think of this class as a brand new lesson. You can select certain characters to study and compare, or themes to look at to review the whole quarter. Look at the memory verses and see how they can be a springboard into a review. These require a little bit of work on your part, but it can be a rewarding way to tie up the past twelve weeks.

Finally, remember to soak in the words of God. After reviewing God's wonderful teachings, have a small snack fellowship. Sing hymns, or go outside and enjoy His creations. You can do a play that sums up the learning that has taken place. And don't forget that you work with a wonderful group of teachers. Brainstorm with your fellow RE workers for fantastic ideas to end your quarter. May God remember all your labor for Him.

Activity**“What Do You Believe?”**

Instructions: Give each student a partner and one of the descriptions of Jesus. Tell the pairs to brainstorm how these descriptions of Jesus can occur in our life today. Afterward, each pair will perform a skit for the rest of the students in the class, who are to guess which description of Jesus they are acting out. E.g., “Jesus is my Savior”; students preach to their friends so that their friends may know who can save them. “Jesus is my teacher”; students put what they learn in their RE classes into practice.

Life Application**Understanding God’s Teachings—God’s Faithfulness**

God is not a person who would change or break His promises. Certainly not! God is faithful; He keeps His promises to us. We can have faith in God without a doubt.

What are some of God’s promises to us? [Allow students to share.] God has promised us that He will give us the Holy Spirit. He has also promised us that if we believe in Him and follow His commandments, we can go to heaven. Furthermore, God has promised us that He will never leave us alone. There are countless promises of God in the Bible (see if you can name some more). We don’t have to doubt and we don’t have to be afraid because we know that God is faithful.

Divide the whiteboard into two columns, one for scenarios and one for God’s promises. Then write the following five scenarios and five promises in random order. Ask the students to match the promises to the scenarios.

Scenarios

1. Sarah has been praying for the Holy Spirit. All of her classmates have already received the Holy Spirit.
2. Teddy’s mom is very strict so he doesn’t want to listen to her all the time.
3. Lucas has been afraid of sleeping by himself in his room because he recently saw a news report on a scary robbery.
4. Jessie’s friend has invited her to a birthday party on the Sabbath, and she’s wondering if God would care if she skipped service.
5. Kevin feels really bad about hitting another classmate on purpose.

God’s Promises
