A Day of Victory at Mount Carmel with Elijah

Let's imagine that we are all up on Mt. Carmel right now.

was the true God.

"So Ahab sent for all the children of Israel, and gathered the prophets together on Mount Carmel. And Elijah came to all the people, and said, 'How long will you falter between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow Him; but if Baal, follow him.' But the people answered him not a word" (1 Kgs 18:20-21).

Elijah opened with a powerful question: "How long will you falter between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow Him; but if Baal, follow him."The Bible tells us, "The people answered him not a word."

When Elijah asked the Israelites how long they would keep going back and forth between idols and God, they didn't know how to respond. It is dangerous to be indecisive when choosing whom to worship.

Let's go through all the steps to see how God showed Himself to be the strongest at the end.



We need to clarify whom we need to <u>w</u>____: God or Baal?





Elijah proposed to prepare a <u>s</u>. He allowed the prophets of Baal to choose one of two available bulls. Elijah would use the other. The prophets would prepare the animal and place it on the altar. But they were not to put fire under it. This was the key. Fire was needed to make a burnt offering and this was the real test to see who





A <u>p</u>______ contest! Elijah told the prophets to call on Baal; he would call on the Lord. So, the challenge began!






The false prophets' god did not <u>a</u>. There was no voice.

"So they took the bull which was given them, and they prepared it, and called on the name of Baal from morning even till noon, saying, 'O Baal, hear us!' But there was no voice; no one answered. Then they leaped about the altar that they had made. And so it was, at noon, that Elijah mocked them and said, 'Cry aloud, for he is a god; either he is meditating, or he is busy, or he is on a journey, or perhaps he is sleeping and must be awakened.' So they cried aloud, and cut themselves, as was their custom, with knives and lances, until the blood gushed out on them. And when midday was past, they prophesied until the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice. But there was no voice; no one answered, no one paid attention" (vv. 26-29).

TRULY KNOWING GOD!

Jacob looked down at his sandwich and thought, "They always talk about these things every single day! I don't play the latest games, and I don't watch that show. I feel so left out!" Grudgingly eating his sandwich, Jacob remembered how he had learned about the idols of the world in RE class recently. A light bulb suddenly lit up in his head. "What if... those games and that TV show... are their idols?" Even though Jacob felt left out at times, he knew that it was good that he didn't follow his friends in worshipping those idols. He wanted to be like Elijah and



follow the true God. As he walked home that day, instead of being upset, Jacob eagerly thought about learning the word of God so that he could draw closer to Him. Entering the door, Jacob exclaimed, "I'm home, Mom! Are you free to read the Bible with me?" With a smile on her face and a Bible in hand, his mother soon appeared, and together, they read the story of Elijah on Mount Carmel. After reading, they prayed together. Feeling refreshed, Jacob thought, "Wow, why didn't I ever think of reading the Bible after school before?" After that day, Jacob was determined to read the Bible as often as he could and to draw close to God.



Scenario B






Scenario 3


The power of prayer should not be underestimated because the power resides in God. 1 John 5:14 tells us, "Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that If we ask anything according to His will, He hears us."

1. We must pray in agreement with His will. That means our desires line up with His. When we pray according to God's will, God responds powerfully.

Which prayer is according to God's will?

"Blake, honey, we have something to tell you." Blake looked at his parents sitting next to him on the sofa. "You know how your father has been trying to look for a better job? Well, he found one! And the house we're moving into is even closer to church than this house!" Blake's eyes brightened and just as he was about to say something, his mother continued. "But...it's on the other side of the country, and we will have to move in two months." Blake's eyes sunk, and he found himself staring at his hands. Noticing his change in demeanor, Blake's mom reassured him, "I know that you have a lot of friends here, and that you spent a lot of time decorating your room, but that doesn't mean you won't make a lot of new friends in your new school! And you can still talk to your old friends using your computer. You're not going to lose any of your friends; actually, you'll make even more friends! And all those decorations and things in your room? Of course we'll bring those with us! It'll be like the same exact room, just... in a different city!" Blake could tell that his mom was trying really hard to

cheer him up, and he knew that his father had been working so hard at his current job. It was making his father really tired and sad every day, and he didn't want to see him like that anymore. He knew that God must have helped his father get this new job, and that it was God's will for them to move, even if it meant going to a completely new school and making new friends. Blake looked up at his mom. "Will I get to paint my new room the same way, too?" His mother replied, smiling, "You can paint it however you want!" That night, Blake knelt down to pray. "Dear God, thank You for blessing my father with this new job. I'm sad that I have to move, but I know that You always want what is best for us. It's going to be hard to say goodbye to all my friends. Please give me the strength to support my parents and to have complete faith in Your will. Amen."





"But I don't want to move! All my friends are here, and I like it here! I'm going to hate you both forever if you make us move!" Blake's father had just found a new job in a city clear across the country, but it required their family to move in two months time. This job had higher pay, better benefits, and it was in a nice neighborhood. What's better, their new house would be much closer to church than their current one! But Blake didn't want to hear it. He didn't want to move, and he made sure that his parents knew it. Ever since Blake's parents told him that they would be moving to a place far away, he stopped listening to them. "Blake, it's time for dinner! Come down!" Still fuming from their announcement, Blake ignored his mother, even though it was two weeks later. He knew that his mother would leave dinner on the table for him, and he didn't care if he was acting

badly. His believed his parents were being selfish. They don't care that I have so many friends here. They don't care that I like my room in this house. My parents don't care about me at all! I know my parents can't see it right now, but God, can you please help change their minds so they can see the big mistake that they are making? Thank You! Amen."

2. We must pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests (Eph 6:18).

A. Powerful prayer that overcomes sickness.

"Your husband may never walk again, Mrs. Banks." Penny overheard the doctor talking to her mother. Two days ago, her father had been in a devastating car accident, which injured most of his body. But she didn't know it was this bad until just now. She thought that doctors could heal everyone and make them 100% again. But it's clear that she was wrong.

For the next two years, Penny prayed every day before her parents woke up in the morning, in addition to their daily family prayers. Contrary to what the doctor said, it seemed like her father was getting better, but slowly. Neither her parents, the doctors, nor Penny were sure if her father would ever regain full control of his legs. Each morning, Penny knelt down to pray. "Dear God, thank You for blessing me with this loving family. Even though my father can't walk right now, he is still smiling every day and I always have fun sitting on his lap and giving him a hug. And my mother always encourages him when he does his physical therapy exercises! God, the doctors could not heal my father, but I know that You can. You are the Creator, and the One who has power and might. You

healed a person in the Bible without even seeing that person! How great is Your mercy! If it is Your will, please help my father walk again. I know that he has complete faith in You, too. Thank You again for all the blessings You've given us. Amen."

"Let's go, Penny! The sun isn't going to wait for us!" Penny's father yelled from downstairs. They were going to the beach today! And her father promised that he would bring her into the ocean to let her play around a little bit! "OK! OK! Almost done!" Penny grabbed something and rushed out to the garage, where her parents were waiting. At the beach, Penny's mother set up a blanket and a beach umbrella, and then the time came. As



Penny saw her father running towards the ocean, she closed her eyes and said, "Thank You, God, for giving my family this moment. Two years ago, the doctors told my mother that my father wouldn't walk anymore. But today, I have witnessed Your amazing mercy and might. Only You have the power to heal, and only You have power over everything: the birds, the air, the sea, everything. You are the God almighty. Amen." Then, she ran off after him.

B. Powerful prayer that defeats demons.

"It happened again, Mom!" Addison's voice quivered as she recounted what had happened last night. "I was praying when suddenly, I felt a jab really hard in my side. I opened my eyes and looked around, but no one was there! I closed my eyes and continued praying, but it happened again! I was too scared to continue praying with my eyes closed, so I stopped and went to bed." Addison's mother had a concerned look on her face. "Addison, I think maybe a demon was trying to stop you from praying. We need to pray together about this as a family and cast it out. We can't let this demon win!" Addison gasped. "A demon? But I'm scared! What if the demon does something worse?" Addison asked. "Don't worry, Addison; God is on our side. Just have complete faith and pray to Him sincerely. He has power over demons and He can defeat them! We can even pray right now!"



Addison's mother called their family together, and as one, they started praying. In her prayer, Addison said, "Dear God, I'm really scared right now. I've never encountered demons before, but I keep feeling a mysterious jab in my side when I pray sometimes! And no one is ever there when I open my eyes! But I feel that something doesn't want me to pray to You! I know that You are an all-powerful God. In RE class, I have learned how You cast out demons from so many people in the Bible! May You please also help me overcome whatever it is that is bothering me when I pray. I know that only You have the power to help and only in Your name can demons be cast out. It sounds like something is coming from the kitchen, but Mom and Dad just left five minutes ago!" Andrew and Arthur tiptoed into the hallway overlooking the kitchen. To their shock, they found an intruder in their house looking through all the drawers. Panicked, Andrew and Arthur guickly ran to their room and locked the door. Arthur dialed the police and whispered their address and situation. Not long after, the policemen came and the intruder ran into the backyard. The police were able to catch him and put him in jail. However, Arthur and Andrew couldn't forget about what happened. Each night, they would stay awake with flashlights, too afraid to sleep. Each morning, their eyes would be red, they would be too tired to stay awake in school. Andrew and Arthur's parents installed new locks and windows, but that wasn't enough to comfort them. One day, they brought Andrew and Arthur t together for a family talk. "Boys, we know that you're still scared about what happened, but God protected you both that day. Instead of going upstairs, the intruder stayed downstairs the entire time, trying to take things from the living room. God will always watch over us, but it is important that we also pray to Him when we need help. So, every day, let's come together to pray and give thanks for His protection and ask for His peace to abide in us, OK?" Andrew and Arthur nodded silently in agreement. They didn't want to lose another night of sleep. "In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, we pray." Their father started the prayer, and Andrew and Arthur each prayed for the same thing. "Dear God, thank You for protecting us from that intruder. We were terrified that something bad would happen to us. We thought we were alone, but now we know that we are never alone. You will always be standing on our side, protecting us. But even though we have faith in You, it's still a little hard for us to be at peace completely. We need wholehearted faith; we need to trust in you 100%. God, You are a compassionate God. I know that You want us to be in peace, too. Testimony

Sister Elizabeth who specializes and is gifted in flower arranging was asked by the church to do a few special flower arrangements for the church dedication. Sis. Elizabeth wanted the flower arrangement to be as nice and fresh as possible for the dedication, so as per her usual practice to ensure fresh flowers for the day, she started the flower arrangements the night before. She spent lots of time on one particular arrangement because it was the largest one and it was going to be at the main entrance. She worked really hard and even stayed past midnight to finish all the flower arrangements allocated to her. This was a big church, and there were many things to be done



in the chapel as well as outside, so many members stayed to help clean and organize the church for the dedication. Finally, she finished for the night and went home to rest. She planned to come an hour early the next morning to do one final check, and perhaps give the flowers a quick mist spray before everyone arrived for the dedication.

To other people, this may just have been another pot of flowers. But to Sister Elizabeth, this was what she felt God had gifted her with, so she was especially dedicated to ensuring that it was done to the best of her abilities.

However, early next morning, she arrived an hour beforehand, only to find that the main flower arrangement for the entrance was no longer there. After asking around, she found out that sometime between last night after she left and this morning before she arrived, a church member felt the floor needed another cleaning and vacuuming. Unfortunately the member who did the vacuuming accidentally knocked over the flower arrangement, and it was completely ruined.

Sister Elizabeth was devastated. It was too late to do anything about it. She didn't have the time, the equipment, or the flowers to make a replacement. After spending hours last night on the arrangement and sacrificing her sleep, in the end, she couldn't present the nice arrangement the church had asked her to make.

So, in the prayer during dedication, she asked God, "Why did you let this happen? I did that work for you, God. That arrangement was done for this dedication to glorify You. Why did this accident have to happen?"

Praise God that, during the dedication, God opened her heart and comforted her. She felt God's comfort, but more importantly she felt God teaching her. God let her understand that the flower arrangement was her offering to God, not to the people attending the dedication. Whether or not other people saw it wasn't important. God had seen it. God had accepted her offering. When she came to realize this thought, she felt peace and joy fill her heart.

The most important aspect of our dedication to God is what God sees, and not what other people see. If we dedicate our work to God with a pure, willing, joyful, and thankful heart, God will see it, even if other people do not see it.




