
Second Woman's Testimony

HOW CAN WE OBTAIN WISDOM FROM ABOVE?

Instructions: Read the following scenarios and answer the questions that follow.

Scenario #1

Mary is eager to seek after God's wisdom, and she prays about it every day. Mary thinks that praying to God is the fastest way to obtain God's wisdom, and that reading the Bible is too slow because some Scripture is very difficult to interpret. Therefore, Mary never reads the Bible and believes that God will give her wisdom directly.

Reference Verse: "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and of spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." (Heb 4:12)



Discussion Questions

- 1. Do you agree with Mary that there is no need to read the Bible and that praying to God is the fastest way to obtain wisdom?
- 2. What does Mary lack in her pursuit of God's wisdom?

Scenario #2

Helen studies the Bible on a regular basis with her family, as well as with brothers and sisters from church. She gets very excited every time when she learns something new from the Scripture. However, her knowledge of the Bible does not seem to reflect in her daily life. For example, she knows that God wants us to be gentle and slow to speak, but almost every day, she yells at her little brother and fights with him.

- 2. What changes can Helen make in her pursuit of God's wisdom?
