#### II. The Wrong Way vs. The Right Way

#### Exodus 17:1-4

The Israelites had no water to drink. Instead of relying on God to provide water for them, they contended with Moses and demanded that he give them water. They complained against him and said that he had brought them out of Egypt to kill them with thirst.

#### Genesis 30:1

### IV. Short Answer and Life Application

- David was able to be victorious because he had faith in the one true God. He had courage and the conviction that God would give him the victory. Today, when we encounter giants, we must also be like David and believe that God can give us the victory. It is important to rely on God and turn to Him when we
- face problems or difficulties, just as David did. When David had the chance to kill Saul, he chose to spare Saul. He refused to kill God's anointed, showing everyone that he feared and respected God. Instead, he left Saul a sign that he had been there and had spared his life. In our lives today, we must remember not to follow our emotions blindly and instead think 3. about what God wants us to do.
- David invited Jonathan's son Mephibosheth, who was lame, to live with him in the palace and to eat at his table continually. He also restored Saul's land to him, and commanded Saul's servant to work the land and bring in the harvest for Mephibosheth. Nowadays. there are many different ways we can show kindness to others. Even something as small as giving a smile can be an act of kindness.
- Solomon asked for wisdom so that he could have an understanding heart to judge God's people and be able to discern between good and evil. When we encounter situations in which we don't know what to do, we must remember to pray and ask for wisdom
- 5. from God. He always know the best way for us. King Solomon did many things that God had instructed kings not to do, such as marry foreign wives, accumulate riches, and multiply horses. Eventually, all these things distracted him and caused his heart to turn away from God. There are many ways to flee from our weaknesses, but in the least, we must pray to God to help with our weaknesses and read the Bible so that we can keep His word in our heart.
