E2 Year 1 Book 1 "Jesus Is My Savior"

Book 1 provides an in-depth study of the events surrounding Jesus' life and death and the importance they play in our lives. In addition, students will be learning about the three sacraments and how they play key roles in our journey.

The main objectives for this quarter are:

1. To understand the significance of Jesus' life and death.
2. To understand the significance of the three sacraments: Baptism, Holy Communion, and Footwashing.
3. To know that Jesus came to earth and sacrificed Himself so we could have the hope of a heavenly future with Him.
