MIRACLES OF SUPPLY

"And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work." (2 Corinthians 9:8)

A. The Miracle of Finding a Coin in a Fish's Mouth (Mt 17:24–27)

After talking to the temple tax collector, Peter came to Jesus. As the Son of God, Jesus Christ should be free from such a tax – the temple is His. However, to prevent unnecessary offense, Jesus Christ told Peter where to find money. Jesus' command sounds illogical, but Peter followed with complete faith and obedience, and experienced how God's supply is not of this world.

Learning About Jesus Christ from His Supply:

- 1. Jesus Christ is all-knowing
- 2. Jesus Christ is Lord of creation (Col 1:16)

B. The Miracle of Catching a Great Number of Fish (Lk 5:3–10)

After borrowing Peter's boat to teach the multitudes, Jesus asked Peter to launch the boat into the deep and let down the net. Peter followed the command of the Lord without hesitation. He immediately experienced a blessing beyond all expectations (Lk 11:28).

The Purpose of God's Supply:

- 1. To shift our reliance from ourselves to God
- 2. To increase our understanding of God
- 3. To bring self-awareness

C. The Miracle of Breakfast by the Sea (Jn 21:4–11)

Knowing that the disciples went back to being fisherman, Jesus Christ, standing ashore, did not rebuke them but instead cared for their physical needs (Joel 2:13). Further, despite the abundance of their catch, the net did not break. In the same way, God's blessings can be abundantly rich, but will never add to our worries (Prov 10:22). After experiencing the miracle, Peter immediately plunged into the sea to swim ashore to Lord Jesus Christ.

The Goal of God's supply:

- 1. To draw us closer to God (Jas 4:8)
- 2. To let us use what God has given us to do His work

- How do we answer to God's providence?
