## BARNABAS AND MARK

*“Therefore comfort each other and edify one another, just as you also are doing.” (1 Thessalonians 5:11)*

### Objectives

<i>Knowledge of God’s Will</i>	God desires for us to offer ourselves to His work and pastor His sheep.
<i>Knowledge of God</i>	God is a comforter who uses His workers to build others up. He is a Spirit who guides and leads His workers to accomplish His work.
<i>Good Work</i>	Exhibit the qualities of a good person. Seek the fullness of the Holy Spirit and remain convicted in our faith. Encourage and comfort others with God’s word.

### A. Barnabas

Barnabas was a man of sound morals, trustworthy and guided by the Holy Spirit (Acts 11:24).

#### A Good Man

- *Barnabas was concerned for the welfare of the church (Acts 4:36–37):* Barnabas was one of many who decided to share his possessions with the church. His generous gesture exemplified his faith and love for the Lord.
- *Barnabas showed care and concern (Acts 11:27–30):* Barnabas showed that he understood the importance of unity and of helping one another in difficult times.

#### Full of the Holy Spirit

- *“Son of Encouragement” (Acts 11:19–26):* Barnabas encouraged the members in Antioch, using positive words to remind the congregation to stand firm and keep their faith in God.
- *One Who Pastors (Acts 11:25–26):* Barnabas and Saul both worked together to teach and train the members in the Antioch church in the doctrine and the truth.
- *A Prophet and a Teacher (Acts 13:1–4):* Barnabas held two important roles—a messenger of God and a teacher gifted in instructing others in God’s word.

#### Full of Faith

- *Barnabas and Saul (Acts 9:26–27):* Barnabas chose to have faith in God’s power and saw Saul not as a persecutor, but as someone who had truly seen Jesus.
- *Barnabas and Mark:* Although Mark had left them before (Acts 13:13), Barnabas did not give up on Mark. He saw past the faults of men and trusted in God’s transformative power.

### B. Mark

#### A Good Helper

- *Preaching the gospel:* Mark traveled with Barnabas and Paul but left them during their first trip; he continued training with Barnabas on a second trip some time later.
- *The Gospel of Mark:* Mark closely followed the older workers and learned a great deal from them, enabling him to write down the life of Jesus and His teachings.

### Life Application

1. **Be a good person:** To be of sound morals like Barnabas, it is important to have love.
2. **Be filled with the Holy Spirit:** The Spirit can strengthen and guide us like He did Barnabas, but to be filled with the Spirit, we must empty ourselves and welcome Him into our hearts.
3. **Be full of faith:** Faith takes time to cultivate. It is important to ask God to help us become full of faith.
4. **Learn to encourage and comfort others:** It is important to use God’s word with wisdom in a manner that edifies others.
