Objectives

Knowledge of God

Introduction

Antioch in Syria was populated by diverse groups of people and was an important junction of trade routes between Damascus, Palestine, Egypt, and the Aegean. It was also a center of architecture and learning. It was at this strategic city that Paul began and ended his missionary journeys.

A. In the Footsteps of Paul

Paul's first missionary journey was far-reaching, and full of many obstacles and challenges. Eventually, however, he made it safely back to Antioch in Syria, establishing and helping churches as he went.

B. The Challenges and Obstacles of Preaching

Belief in the gospel opens the inner eyes of men so that they are no longer slaves to darkness but walk as children of light. But preaching the gospel is not easy. Satan will not surrender a soul without a fight, and he seeks to prevent people from receiving and accepting the truth.
