PAUL'S THIRD MISSIONARY JOURNEY

A. Priscilla, Aquila, and Apollos' Ministry (Acts 18:24–28)

- 1. Apollos was mighty in the Scriptures, fervent in Spirit, accurate in the Lord's word, spoke boldly, and, despite his knowledge, was humble enough to receive instruction and guidance.
- 2. Priscilla and Aquila shared a deep understanding of the truth and served quietly with humility and love. Their aim was not to prove others wrong but to instruct out of love for the sake of the truth.

B. Paul's Ministry in Ephesus (Acts 19)

- True Baptism and Receiving the Holy Spirit (Acts 19:1–10)
 Paul discovered that the disciples in Ephesus had an incomplete understanding of the truth.
 When they were baptized in Jesus' name, they were able to receive the Holy Spirit.
- Miracles of God (Acts 19:11–20)
 Many miracles were performed through Paul, to the point that some Jews attempted to
 emulate him to their own detriment. The sons of Sceva's lack of belief, ulterior motives, misuse
 of Jesus' name, and lack of God-fearing lives led to their humiliation and the strengthening of
 God's word.
- 3. The Riot at Ephesus (Acts 19:21–41)As long as the gospel grows, Satan will launch attacks to limit and oppose it.

C. Paul's Ministry in Greece (Acts 20)

While in Troas, Paul resurrected a man named Eutychus. He later encouraged the elders of Ephesus while in Miletus, knowing that he would not see them again. Paul warned them of the danger that lay ahead and urged them to guard the believers.

D. Paul Returns to Jerusalem (Acts 21:1–17)

God made it clear that both suffering and imprisonment awaited Paul in Jerusalem. But he was resolved to follow the movement of the Spirit (Acts 19:21; 20:22), and was willing to suffer for the Lord's purpose.
