BOOK 1 - "FROM MANKIND'S BIRTH TO THE EXODUS"

Year 2 begins with a deeper study of the Creation. Students will examine God's hand in history, from mankind's birth, to the lives of the Patriarchs, the growth of the Israelite nation, and their freedom from slavery. Students can come to understand God's deliberate work in the establishment of His nation, and His faithfulness to His covenant. The main objectives for this quarter are:

- To gain a deeper understanding of sin, its origins, and the necessity of God's redemption plan.
- To understand that God's covenants are everlasting, even through the generations.
- To understand the depths of God's faithfulness to His people.
