# JACOB: TWO SIGNIFICANT ENCOUNTERS

### A. Jacob's Dream at Bethel

## The Significance of God's Promise

This dream signifies the establishment of the eternal covenant between God and Jacob and his descendants. The descending and ascending angels indicated God's constant presence. They are God's ministering spirits, sent by Him to guide, protect, and to keep (Ex 23:20).

#### Jacob's Reaction

Jacob's dream made him realize that he may be able to run away from people, but he could not run from God. This dream was clearly a turning point in Jacob's life. We can see this in the significance of his vow, which can be broken down into three parts: a plea for God's providence, Jacob's personal commitment to God, and his promise towards God.

## B. Jacob Wrestles with God

God could easily have prevailed against Jacob, but instead, they wrestled until morning. Even when the Man caused Jacob's hip to be out of joint, Jacob refused to let Him go until He blessed Jacob.

- 1. The significance of a name change: Jacob lived up to his name throughout his entire life. When the Lord changed His name to Israel, he was no longer a "heel catcher" or one who was deceived, but someone who was restored and renewed. The Lord changed his entire identity.
- 2. Jacob refused to let Him go: Jacob's struggle with God showed his perseverance and determination in seeking God's blessing, and God answered his persistence with a reward: his faith was renewed, and he was blessed.
- 3. Limping to rely on God: It is never God's will that we run from our problems. With the limp that God gave him, Jacob could not use his own strength anymore. He no longer stood by his own power, but by God's.
- 4. The meaning of wrestling: Jacob's persistence teaches us about our attitude in prayer. When we persistently seek out God, His help and strength will come.
- 5. Peniel: Jacob may have been weakened physically, but he was strengthened spiritually. Through the new strength he had received, Jacob could now face Esau with courage from God.
