DIVISION OF THE LAND AND JOSHUA'S FAREWELL

"So the LORD gave to Israel all the land of which He had sworn to give to their fathers, and they took possession of it and dwelt in it." (Joshua 21:43)

Objectives

A. Division of the Land

1. East of the Jordan River: There are no shortcuts

Although well-watered and spacious, the tribes who dwelt in the east lacked the defense of the river and, as a result, were the first to be taken by Assyria in later years. Compromises often result in negative consequences in our faith.

2. West of the Jordan River: Fight to receive our inheritance

Through the drawing of lots, God gave each tribe land according to their size and need. However, they still needed to drive out any remaining enemies. God required His people to put forth their own effort to inherit the land.

3. The Cities of the Levites: God is our inheritance

Although they received no land to call their own, the Levites' abundance would come from God as long as they carried out their spiritual duty of pastoring the people. As God's new priesthood, our inheritance is also in the Lord.

B. Cities of Refuge

Even before entering the promised land, God gave Moses directions regarding the cities of refuge. They were clearly an important aspect of Israel that God wanted to put into place.

- 1. The Old Testament Cities of Refuge: God gave the Israelites specific directions regarding the cities' locations, purpose, the paths towards them, and even the length of stay for those who took refuge.
- 2. The New Testament City of Refuge: The Old Testament cities were an incomplete version of what was to come. All of us are born into sin, the wages of which is death. So, God sent Jesus Christ to save us from perishing, and He, through His blood, gave us true refuge (Heb 6:18).

C. Joshua's Farewell and Death

- 1. Keep God's laws and commandments (Josh 23:6): Joshua wanted the Israelites to remember God's laws and commandments.
- 2. Their success was from God (Josh 23:9–10): It was not their own strength, but God's power that had allowed them to defeat the Canaanites.
- 3. Do not cling to the remnants (Josh 23:13): If they failed to keep God's commandments and instead "clung" to the Canaanite remnants, God's promises would be taken from them.
