DISCERNING TRUE MIRACLES FROM FALSE

"For false christs and false prophets will rise and show great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect." (Matthew 24:24)

C. False Miracles and Christs in the End Time

- 1. False denominations and religions (Mt 24:24; 1 Tim 4:1)
- 2. The lawless one (2 Thess 2:3-4, 9-12; Rev 16:13-14; 19:20)

D. Discerning Miracles with Truth

It is dangerous to base our faith upon miracles, as Satan can also perform them (2 Thess 2:9–10). To discern between what is true and false, we should evaluate according to the truths of the Bible. Ultimately, we must seek out and love the truth. To do so, we must:

- 1. Turn our feet from the things of the world
- 2. Desire the truth as a deer pants for water
- 3. Pursue the word with friends
- 4. Memorize and practice God's words
- 5. Do not love unrighteousness or the things of the world

E. Discerning False Prophets

Matthew 7:15–18 teaches us that we must know the characteristics of false prophets.

- 1. Beware of their words: They often speak lies, and are arrogant and prideful.
- 2. Beware of their motives: They are often motivated by personal benefits, and love receiving respect and honor.
- 3. Beware of their actions: They employ subtle methods that are cruel, deceptive, and unbiblical.

Just as a tree is consistent in the kind of fruit it produces, a true messenger or worker of God will consistently live out the truth of God's words.

Life Application: Stand Firm in the Faith

- 1. Love the truth
- 2. Do not love unrighteousness or the things of the world
