# MATTHEW, THOMAS, PHILIP, AND BARTHOLOMEW

"As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God." (1 Peter 4:10)

## **Objectives**

Knowledge of God's Will

God desires each of us to contribute to the growth of the church. He has called each of us to preach the gospel.

Knowledge of God

God chooses whom He wills to be His vessels. He loves us and desires for our faith to be strong.

Good Work

Be courageous in evangelizing for God. Pursue a full understanding of the Scriptures.

#### A. Matthew's Servitude and Characteristics

*Understood that he was a sinner:* Matthew's wealth, position, and social status did not stop him from following Jesus, and he showed both humility and an awareness of his own status as a sinner.

#### B. Thomas' Servitude and Characteristics

Willing to follow Jesus to whatever end: From John 11:16 and John 14:2–24, we can see that Thomas was anxious to follow Jesus and wanted to understand how.

Went from doubt to affirmation: Thomas did not believe the others' testimony that Jesus had returned; he wanted physical proof. Jesus did not rebuke him for his lack of faith, however, and showed Himself once more. Thomas' awestruck reply shows his increase in faith and his understanding of both Jesus' resurrection and His deity.

### C. Philip's Servitude and Characteristics

Eager to preach for the Lord: As soon as Philip became a disciple, he went to his friend Bartholomew and invited him to come and see Jesus.

Enthusiastic about pursuing the truth: When Jesus taught about the Father, Philip asked for clarification, prompting Jesus to elaborate and import an important teaching (Jn 14:8–11).

#### D. Bartholomew's Servitude and Characteristics

Well versed in the Scriptures: Philip's reference to the Scriptures clearly implied Bartholomew's own knowledge and understanding, and it was likely his scriptural understanding that allowed him to perceive Jesus' identity.

Had a heart with no deceit: As Bartholomew approached, Jesus immediately praised him, saying, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no deceit!" (Jn 1:47).

## **Life Application**

- 1. Recognize our gifts and use them to serve God.
- 2. Take courage in preaching and letting others see Christ in us.
